Of paternal Basque origins, hence Mayagoitia, a maternal German hence Burmeister, a maternal Crow, Sept of the Ross Clan, student at Mt. Sacred Heart Catholic School, San Antonio, Texas from kindergarten to 3rd grade. An excellent student, he loved academics. Wishing to become an astronomer, an officer working at Kirtland AFB, New Mexico, instead he spent about 12 years in the USAF. He loved the landscape and mountains of New Mexico. At the end of the Vietnam War, the AF asked most officers to submit their resignations, a great blow to Ed. He loved Scottish Country Dancing in Kentucky and Florida.

His career continued as an employee or contractor for various aerospace firms over the years. He also taught mathematics at Pima County Community College, Arizona. He retired to Katy, Texas residing with his nephew Vincent for about 10 years.

Very active in the Houston Royal Scottish Country Dance and Choral Society, he enjoyed many friends there.
